Application Assistance Offered Wednesdays & Thursdays
to Eligible Immigrants Seeking U.S. Citizenship

WHO: East New York Immigration Center (a division of the Center for Law and Social Justice at Medgar Evers College, CUNY)

WHAT: The East New York Immigration Center will offer free assistance to immigrants who intend to apply for U.S. Citizenship. Assistance with applications will take place at the *Immigration Fair* to be held Wednesdays and Thursdays, June 9 to June 24. Each fair will be held from 11:00 am to 5:00 pm. This free service is open to immigrants who have received their green card and are interested in obtaining full citizenship in the US.

Participants will need to bring the following items:

- A check or money order in the amount of \$675.00 payable to the U.S. Dept. of Homeland Security
- Two passport size color photographs
- Personalized green card
- All passports since obtaining green card
- Marriage/ Divorce history
- Children history, if applicable, i.e. birth certificates
- Employment history
- Criminal history, if applicable
- Proof of home address
